
This survey was carried out from June to November 2009 in the framework of the EC initiatives in communication outreach for nanotechnology. It received inputs from 2.000 respondents in 25 European Member and Associated States. Focus groups, expert interviews, national surveys and online surveys were used to study the knowledge, interest, attitudes, opinions, concerns and expectations on nanotechnology in various age segments of young people. Results show that:

- interest is far exceeding the present state of knowledge, also in terms of future education and career development;
- television, radio, press and schools are the main sources of information, while the internet is used for deep search; science centres and special events are more important for younger teens;
- applications of nanotechnology in health, information and communication technologies (ICT) and sustainability match the interest of young people; however, receiving balanced information on their potential impacts on privacy, consumer protection, environmental and human health is crucial;
- females are more interested in health applications, while males favour those in ICT. Finally, all young people ask for setting up independent regulation and control agencies.
